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## Vaccines During COVID-19



Staying at home keeps you and your child safe but they should still receive important well child care and vaccines.

- Vaccines protect your infant against 14 diseases which can cause serious illness involving major organs like the lungs and brain.
- Many of these diseases may be carried by others at home or in the community without their knowledge.
- To keep you and your child safe, clinics may offer separate times and/or spaces for vaccine only visits.
- Vaccines can be given safely when your child is sick, as long as temperature is less than 101°F.

Your child is considered protected if they received vaccinations through 18 months of age.
