# **COVID-19 Update and Resources 1/09 - 1/22**

## **PA & Federal Updates**

- There were 90,907 new cases in Pennsylvania since our last update on 1/08, bringing the total case count to 794,172 (includes confirmed and probable cases) in all 67 PA counties. Statewide percent positivity for the week of January 8-14 sits at 12.7%, representing a 2.3% decrease in state positivity from December 25-31. - This week, the Pennsylvania Department of Health (PA DOH) released version
  5 of their <u>interim vaccine plan</u>, expanding group 1a's vaccination
  designation to include anyone over 65 and people ages 16-64 with serious
  medical conditions that make them more at risk for severe illness due to
  COVID-19. This move will extend eligibility to approximately 3.5 million
  Pennsylvanians. <u>Read more</u>.
- Following PA DOH's release of their updated plan, Cindy Findley, Deputy Secretary for Health Promotion and Disease Prevention, stated in a Facebook Live broadcast, "We are hearing from our vaccine providers that they have vaccinated all the non-affiliated healthcare workers in their area. While at the same time, we are hearing from health workers that they have not been vaccinated." With the expansion of group 1a, we expect that all physicians and healthcare providers have been or are soon to be vaccinated; We want to hear from you, our PA AAP members about your experience. - The PA AAP Chapter congratulates Dr. Rachel Levine on her nomination to serve as the Assistant Secretary of Health at the Department of Health and Human Services under the Biden Administration. We hope for a swift confirmation. Though her confirmation will be a loss for Pennsylvania, children and families nationwide will greatly benefit from Dr. Levine's presence in Washington. Read more.

 On January 22, PA DOH released a Health Alert with recommendations and considerations for point-of-care (POC) antigen testing, a less sensitive alternative to molecular testing (PCR). In issuing this instructional document, <u>found here</u>, PA DOH recognizes the advantage of POC's rapid turnaround and advocates for its effective usage.
